

Technology

Grovecrest is committed to the integration of technology in instruction. We have made available iPad tablets for our teachers through Trust Land funds. Each kindergarten through 2nd grade class has six iPad minis for small group instruction. We are roughly 2:1 student to Chromebooks for 4th -6th grade with 5th grade at 1:1. We have converted old iPads to a roaming class set as we focus towards a goal of a 2:1 student to device ratio. In our new school, each classroom is equipped with an interactive whiteboard and a sound enhancement system. We have 12 iPad Minis used specifically to teach students Digital Citizenship through the proper use of our social media accounts.

We foresee teachers and students fully incorporating our technology to enhance 21st century learning and classroom participation.
