Measurements

Kindergarten through 3rd-grade teachers will use the DIBELS assessment to compare the beginning of year results, middle of year results, and end of year results. They will also progress monitor throughout the year to help prepare students for each DIBELS assessment period. 4th grade through 6th-grade teachers will compare results from 2018-2019 RISE results with 2019-2020. results in RISE. They will also use results from RISE benchmarks to aid them in preparing students for the RISE assessment in the spring of 2020.

Action Plan Steps

Teachers will be paid to administer the DRA/DIBELS prior to the start of school thus enabling them to begin guided reading and working with students having specific needs at the beginning of the school year.

Teachers will be provided with a substitute teacher during the school year. They will be given the opportunity to perform inter-rater reliability exercises with interpreting reading data as grade level teams.

Funds will be set aside that will be matched by the district to provide early morning double dosing classes taught by certified teachers to 1st-6th grade struggling readers.

An aide will be provided to work in direct instruction with 1st and 2nd-grade students who are struggling readers in Double Dosing.

Funds will be used to cover summer collaboration for those teams who are not supported by District funds for 4 days.

An aide will be provided for both kindergarten and 1st grade to work in direct instruction with students in reading.

Aides will be provided to work in direct instruction with students and help teachers integrate the state music core into grade level reading and writing curriculum. Research shows that music and the fine arts improve reading.

Funds will be used to purchase supplies to help the integration of the music core into reading and writing.

Funds will be used to support the purchase of supplies, provide maintenance and repairs for current equipment, and purchase headphones to be used for accommodations for students using technology.

Funding will be provided for professional development and other learning opportunities so teachers can obtain more knowledge and skills in implementing Vision for Learning and 21st-century instruction. In addition, teachers will be trained throughout the year through professional development, monthly faculty meetings, and teacher observations on ways to enhance student learning in all content areas while incorporating Alpine School District's Vision for Learning and 21st-century instruction.

A set of 20 Chromebooks will be purchased for 2nd grade to support tech integration in deep learning and Alpine District's Vision for Learning.

A Chromebook cart will be purchased for Chromebooks already being used in 5th grade to support tech integration in deep learning and Alpine District's Vision for Learning.

A set of eight programmable robots will be purchased for our computer lab to support tech integration in deep learning and Alpine Districts Vision for Learning.

Goal #2 Goal

Students in grades 4-6 will achieve 45 percentile points in Median Growth Percentile in RISE math assessment. Students in grade 3 will improve math proficiency by 2% by the end of the 2018-19 school year. Considering the RISE assessment has not been administered for the 2018-2019 school year, we currently do not have RISE results in order to state a percentage of growth we will need to achieve in order to accomplish the goal of 45 percentile points for Median Growth Percentile in 2019-2020.

We will compare end of year RISE 2019 results to end of year RISE 2020 results. Students will be monitored by common assessments, flex time, and a benchmark test at least three times per year. 2020 SAGE scores will be compared to winter RISE benchmark scores to analyze student growth.

Action Plan Steps

An aide will be compensated for teaching Double Dosing during the school day for 6th grade struggling mathematicians. He/She will work in direct instruction with students. Teachers will be trained throughout the year through professional development, monthly faculty meetings, and teacher observations on ways to enhance student learning in math while incorporating Alpine School District's Vision of Learning and 21st-century instruction.
