Introduction of New Members

The committee welcomed new parent member, Nicole Pasquini and new teacher members, Misha Bacca and Katherine Mccaman.

Review of SCC Responsibilities

Principle Tillman lead the review and went over an overview of what our year timeline will be and what we will focus on. The main jobs of SCC are: Trustland Funds, Safe Routes to School, SNAP Plan (which will need to be updated this year), Digital Citizenship, Professional Development Plans, School Improvement Plan.

Part of being on the SCC member contact information must be posted. Principle Tillman made a motion seeing if any were opposed to having their contact information posted on the school website. None were opposed, the motion passed.

Review of This Year's Plan and What Has Been Purchased So Far

2 Chromebook carts (with classroom set of chromebooks on each) and 6 individual chromebooks for the specialty teachers. The teacher members reported that the carts have been used to enhance the already existing wonders program. They are mainly used during the AM and PM hours to best utilized the chromebooks. Through mastery connect and google classroom they can better see typing and writing progress. Now they can better identify typing problems vs. writing problems.

They will be able to give a better report on math improvements as the year progresses. Teachers are seeking more training to best utilize the tools they already have.

The trustland funds were also used to pay for summer teacher collaborations. The 6th grade teachers were able to better prepare and prep for the science program since the core has changed.

Booster Club, with the money more time for aides was added in the afternoons and kindergarten is able to utilize an in class aide.

Nicole posed the question: What is the training of the booster club aides. Principle Tillman answered that all the aides are trained in progress monitoring.

Rebecca posed the question: What are the benefits from pulling the kids from the classroom vs. having them come in early or stay late? Katherine answered that the struggle with the previous way of having kids come in before or after school was having them show up. With pulling kids from the class the teachers can better work with the aides and they pull the kids from classroom time when it will best benefit the kid. More improvement has been seen from the new method of pulling kids from the classroom than having them come in before or after school.
