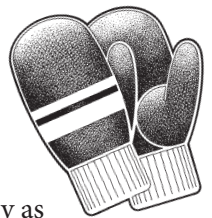

Brrrr, It's Cold Outside! Dressing for Chilly Climates



Wearing the appropriate winter clothing is a good idea if you are planning to venture out in cold weather. This is especially true for children. First, you should make sure to dress them in several different layers of clothing. This will help to keep them warm and dry as they play outdoors. These layers can easily be removed should your child get too hot.

Layer it on -- Layers not only allow for extra trapping of body heat, it can be "shed" so you don't get over-warm while inside. Outer layers should be waterproof, and inner "moisture wicking" to prevent sweat to cause chills.

Cap It Off! -- Much of a person's body heat is lost through the top of their head, and a hat helps keep you warm.

Drink Up! -- Did you know that drinking liquids is important even in colder weather? It's true! As people breathe in and out, the body loses a large volume of water. Giving your child soup or cider to drink will not only help them to warm them up from the inside out, but will keep them well hydrated.

Wintertime can be an exciting time to play outside, but make sure you and your children are well-prepared and well-dressed for the occasion.
