### 2012 - 2013 SCHOOL TRUST LAND

Our 2012-13 School Trust Land plan is based on three specific reading goals. Our first goal is to continue to maintain or increase the number of students who score at proficiency levels (3 and 4) as reflected on the CRT assessment in grades third through sixth. This would be identified by a 2% - 3% increase as reported for each grade. It will also be identified by an increase in the number of UCAS points our school generates.

Our second goal is to see an increase of 10% in proficiency levels, as related to the DRA test (Direct Reading Assessment), with first and second grade students from fall 2012 to spring 2013. To help us achieve this goal we are utilizing "Double Dosing" opportunities for students who are in need of additional Tier 2 interventions.

The third goal is to provide professional development opportunities for teachers as related to reading and language arts.

To help achieve these goals our Trust Land funding for this year is being used to hire teaching assistants and fund professional opportunities for teachers.

#### MOUNT MAHOGANY FUELS UP

As one of our new enrichment activities this year we are getting students excited about eating better and being more active! We are using the Fuel Up To Play 60 Program, as a way of helping everyone be more interested in the food choices they are making and how much physical activity they get daily.

## DOUBLE DOSING CONTINUES TO BE A SUCCESS

We are in our second year of participating in a student remedial program (Tier 2 intervention) known as "Double Dosing." This program focuses on re-teaching reading, writing, and math strategies for struggling students in grades first through sixth. Students targeted for this program are those who are just below grade level.

#### LATINOS IN ACTION

Latinos in Action (LIA) is a cooperative program we have with Pleasant Grove High School. Spanish/English bilingual high school students come twice a week to help our English Language Learners (ELL). These students tutor in reading fluency and comprehension strategies, vocabulary, parts of speech written language, etc.

The biggest advantage of LIA is they are able to help students that may be struggling with English by tutoring them in Spanish. This year we developed a resource library for our ELL students that the LIA use to tutor. This library includes leveled books in Spanish, parts of speech activities, high frequency words, common phrases, letter/sound flashcards, and worksheets that meet the new Utah Core Curriculum. We hope to see great gains in our English Language Learners academic progress because of these resources and how they are used with the LIA tutors!

We currently have 10 high school LIA tutors who are working with our students.
