#### 2012-13 School Trust land Plan

Our 2012-13 School Trust land plan is based on three specific reading goals. Our first goal is to continue to maintain or increase the number of students who score at proficiency levels (3 and 4) as reflected on the CRT assessment in grades third through sixth. This would be identified by a 2% - 3% increase as reported for each grade. It will also be identified by an increase in the number of UCAS points our school generates.

Our second goal is to see an increase of 10% in proficiency levels, as related to the DRA test (Direct Reading Assessment), with first and second grade students from fall 2012 to spring 2013. To help us achieve this goal we are utilizing "Double Dosing" opportunities for students who are in need of additional Tier 2 interventions.

The third goal is to provide professional development opportunities for teachers as related to reading and language arts

To help achieve these goals our Trust land funding for this year is being used to hire teaching assistants and fund professional opportunities for teachers.

#### 2011-12 CRT and DRA Proficiency Percentiles

One of our academic goals last year was to increase the number of students who scored at proficiency levels on the CRT assessment in both reading and math in grades 4–6.

In language arts the 4th grade percentage remained at 76%, the fifth grade percentage increased from 73% to 76%, and the sixth grade percentage increased form 70% to 75%. Our overall percentage in language arts increased from 73% to 75%.

In math the fourth grade percentage remained at 77%, the fifth grade percentage increased from 75% to 77%, and the sixth grade percentage increased from 63% to 71%. Our overall percentage in math increased from 71% to 75%.

Our second academic goal was to increase proficiency levels as related to the DRA assessment in grades first through sixth. In first grade percentages increased from 67% to 77%, second grade percentages increased from 59% to 78%, third grade percentages increased from 65% to 83%, fourth grade percentages increased from 27% to 59%, fifth grade percentages increased from 16% to 34% and sixth grade percentages increased from 47% to 77%.

# 1st grade news

We have had a great time in first grade so far this year! We have been learning how to use reading strategies to become better readers, playing math games to understand number combinations, writing excellent stories, and learning all about how to be good citizens and friends. We have just started learning about the Scientific Method and have had a lot of fun doing experiments.

Please continue reading with your children at home. It really helps improve their reading they are practicing at home and school. Don't forget about RAZ Kids. This is a fun online reading program that children love using. Talk to your teacher if you have any questions about how to use it.

Also, the seasons are changing and the weather is getting quite cold. Please remind your children to wear warm clothes and shoes. Remember to write their names on coats and jackets. It's easy for things to get lost. Thank you for all you are doing at home to help your children succeed. We love teaching your children and know how important these first few years are. Sincerely,

## 5th grade News
