

#### Utah Attendance Awareness Month September 2014



- As many as 7.5 million U.S. students are chronically absent each year.
- Poor attendance habits are often acquired early (preschool) leading to lower reading levels by third grade and setting them up for academic struggles later.
- One in 10 kindergarteners and first graders are chronically absent (2 to three in every class in ASD)
- Chronic absence in first grade predicts later chronic absence, poor academic performance and higher suspension rates in 6<sup>th</sup> grade.
- As early as 6<sup>th</sup> grade, absenteeism can predict whether a student will drop out.
- Even students who miss just 10 days a year are less likely to graduate and less likely to enroll in college.
- A statewide study in Utah found that a student who is chronically absent in any year between 8th and 12<sup>th</sup> grade is 7.4 times more likely to drop out.

Parents worry about students skipping school but not about excused absences.

## Chronic absence is a solvable problem when schools and communities work together.

- 1. Do you help your children get to school on time every day?
- 2. Have you established a regular bedtime and morning routine?
- 3. Do you schedule doctor/dentist visits during non-school hours?
- 4. Do you take your children on vacations during the school year?
- Do you track and monitor how many days of school your children miss?

#### Warning signs and more common symptoms of mental disorders include:

- Persistent irritability
- Major changes in appetite or sleep
- Social withdrawal
- Anger

Mental health disorders can disrupt school performance, harm relationships, and lead to suicide (the third leading cause of death among adolescents). A social stigma continues to surround mental health disorders, this ongoing stigma regarding mental health disorders inhibits some adolescents and their families from seeking help. Mental health issues are often first identified at school.
