What is a Caucus?

Although most states hold primaries, caucuses are another way political parties nominate candidates for election. Caucuses are a series of meetings held across a state. At these meetings, party members discuss the candidates, and then openly vote for state delegates who represent the candidate they support. Those state delegates, in turn, choose delegates to attend the national convention, where they are expected to support the candidate whom they had pledged to support. What is a delegate?

A delegate is a member of a political party who helps determine the party's presidential nominee. Delegates are usually longtime party members, and they vote on the nominee at the party's national convention (see below). Most of them are required to vote for a certain candidate. Their vote is determined by the result of primaries or caucuses in their home states. However, some delegates are unpledged. That means they can vote as they wish.
