To read the bills, you can go to www.loc. gov (it stands for Library of Congress) or

Google "Thomas". It is the Thomas Library of Congress.

You can also go to www.votesmart.org and type in your zip code or the name of the elected individual to find his voting record and the current bills. You can find voting records under www.senate.gov.



You click on the roll call number to see the voting record, the bill name is in the "issue" column. Or you can Google it by knowing the bill number and what session of congress you're wanting to find. There is also www.opencongress.org. Happy researching!

Caucus' will be held April 2014 for the GOP (Republicans) this time, usually held in March & May 2014 for the (DEM). and it is the most important voting forum. Usually held on Tuesday night, so watch for the date and be careful not to hold anything on that day.

We will be meeting in the Kiva for a Coach's meeting at 2:45 that day and a Parent meeting at 3:15.

Commitment for Participants: 1-2 hours a week of focused study time (can be done in 10-20 minute increments or in larger chunks of time) October through February. Students can study on their own or in groups to learn the material in the study guide. Practice sessions will be held once a week at the school from 8-9:05 for track-B students who start school at 9:15 and from 2:20-3:25 for track-A students who start school at 8:00. Two matches will be held at the school during SEPs in the fall Nov 13th & 14th and in the spring March 5th & 6th. Some students will be asked to represent the

school at the district competitions on a Saturday in March 2014.

Commitment for Parents: At least 15 minutes each week to review emails, study guides and encourage your student to study. You will also need to ensure that your student makes it on time to the practices and competitions at the school. Students who ride buses to and from school can use the early bus to get to morning practice or the late bus to get home from afternoon practice.
