1. Land Trusts funds were used to hire a STAR Reading Coordinator with an AmeriCorps Matching Grant. Our reading coordinator trained over 40 volunteers from our local community to tutor individual students in reading 2 times/weekly for 30 minutes.
2. We continued to work on a professional development plan. This year we had Brad Wilcox present a workshop on Writing. Already our teachers are implementing ideas suggested by our presenter. Books were also purchased for teacher use in the classroom on Writing.
3. Aides were hired for First, Second, and Third grades to implement the "Math Tips" program provided by the Utah State Office of Education. One-on-one help is given to students in Math.
4. Funds were provided for Guided Reading books for younger grades.
5. Funds were used to continue to provide technology for students.

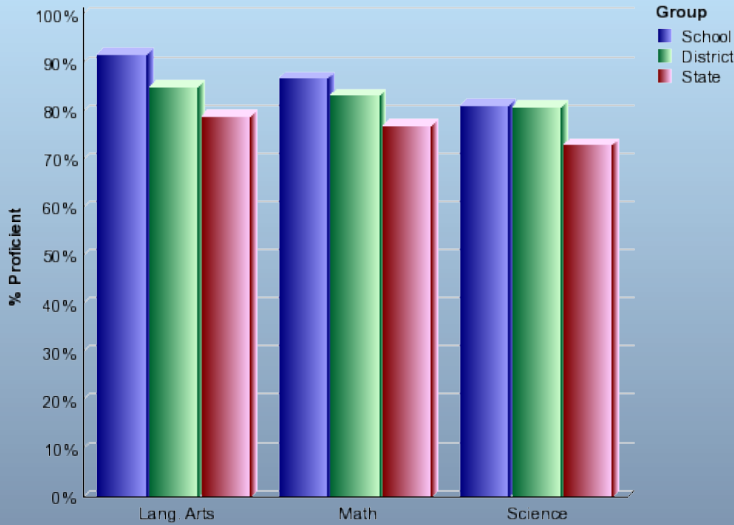
