Attendance:

School progress is increased by regular attendance. Frequent absences tend to disrupt the learning process. If your child is absent, please contact the school (by note or phone call) by 9:15 to excuse him or her. If your child is going to be out of school for an extended period of time, please let his or her teacher know so special arrangements can be made. It will be your child's responsibility to make up missed assignments. Students are expected to be on time and prepared each day.

Discipline Policy:

Everyone deserves to be treated with respect. When a student breaks a classroom or school rule, consequences will be handed out with respect.

If you have questions regarding a specific class discipline plan, please contact the teacher. Classroom discipline plans will be discussed with the students at the start of the new school year.

If your child is ever bullied on the way to school, at school, or on the way home from school, please let your child's teacher know. <u>Bullying is not</u> <u>tolerated</u>.

Homework and Late Work:

Students are expected to read 20 - 30 minutes at home daily. They will be given regular home reading logs on which to record this reading. Students should track their reading minutes daily and turn in their logs at the assigned time.

Other nightly homework will include the following:

- ★ Times Table Study
- * Study for spelling tests, which are given on Fridays.

Students are expected to turn in all assignments on time. Each classroom teacher will determine how late work will be dealt with. This information will be discussed with all students. If questions on classroom policies arise, please contact your child's teacher.

<u>Grading:</u>

Reports of your child's academic progress will be sent home monthly. When you receive these reports, please take a moment to review them with your child. If there are missing assignments showing, please have your child speak to his or her teacher.

Report cards will be sent home at the end of each trimester.
