# Principal's Message

Dear Parents:

January was quite the month at Shelley Elementary. Our students came back from the holiday break and have been enjoying uninterrupted instruction time in their classrooms. This time of the year is very valuable to teachers; our students come back from the break refreshed and ready to learn. We only have a few weeks remaining of the second trimester, and our younger grades enjoyed celebrating the 100th day of the school year this past week. Also during the month of January, each grade level completed the Winter DRA (Direct Reading Assessment).

In preparation for the SAGE testing that will take place, I encourage you to visit the SAGE testing portal site, sageportal.org. This site has many resources for students, parents and teachers to begin preparing for SAGE testing. I encourage each of you to access the site with your children and look at the information contained in it. There are practice tests, information rubrics, webinars and other helpful information that will help to prepare our students for their testing experience. If after accessing the site and you find that you need some guidance or explanation about things, please contact me so we can talk about your questions. It seems we are in a constant process of gathering data to help us monitor how our students are learning, progressing, and adjusting as they go through their school experience.

I encourage each of you to make sure you attend our Parent Teacher Conferences on Wednesday and Thursday, February 4 and 5. It is a great opportunity for teachers and parents to

celebrate areas of strength, progress and growth, and to discuss areas where you can work together for continued improvement and success. There is a strong positive effect on student learning when parents and teachers partner together in the education process.

I would like to thank Heather Miller for her efforts to bring comfort and happiness to our troops that fight for and protect our liberties at home and overseas. Heather was instrumental in managing a project that almost every classroom at Shelley participated in. Each class made cards that had a student handprint on them and a small personal note addressed to members of our military. We had an assembly that gave our students the chance to give those cards to the different branches of the Armed Forces. I have not participated in such a powerful assembly before, as the cards were given to our service members with handheld flags waving, there were many eyes that were not dry in our gym. We appreciate the sacrifice, diligence and service of our Armed Forces. We also appreciate the respect that our Shelley Elementary students showed during the presentation.

Continue to support and help your students in their school work, I know that our Shelley students come prepared and ready to handle the challenges that come their way because of the support they receive from home.

# IDEAS TO HELP YOUR CHILD SUCCEED IN SCHOOL

Going to school regularly is important to your child's future. Children who miss school frequently can fall behind with their work and do poorly on exams. Research suggests that children who attend school regularly are also at less risk of getting involved in crime and substance abuse. You can promote good attendance when you:

- Make sure they understand the importance of good attendance and punctuality.
- Take an interest in their education; ask about school work and encourage them to get involved in school activities.
- Discuss any problems they may have at school; inform their teacher about anything serious.
- Do not let them take time off school for minor ailments; particularly those which would not prevent you from going to work.
- Establish and stick to the basic routines (going to bed early, waking up on time, etc.) that will help your child develop the habit of on-time attendance.
- Provide incentives and consequences for attendance and learning. Set daily, weekly or monthly goals and agree on rewards and punishments. When completed, follow through with the incentives and consequences and then set new goals.
- Come up with a back up plan for who to turn to (another family member, a neighbor or fellow parents) to help you get your child to school if something comes up (e.g. another child gets sick, your car breaks down, etc.).
- Reach out for help if you are experiencing tough times (e.g. transportation, unstable housing, loss of a job, health problems) that make it difficult to get your child to school. Other parents, your child's teacher, principal, social worker, school nurse, afterschool providers or community

- agencies can help you problem solve or connect you to a needed resource.
- If your child is absent, work with the teacher to make sure she or he has an opportunity to learn and make up for the academics missed.
- Arrange appointments and outings after school hours, on weekends or during a school holiday to prevent disruption to your child's education.

This summary includes highlights from the beginning, middle, and end of the story.

We will begin working on how to write a summary as we prepare our students to move on to second arade.

The last week of January we celebrated the  $100^{\text{th}}$  day of school!!! What an exciting day full of fun activities all about the number 100. Zero the Hero has made an appearance several times in first grade as we counted up by 10s to the  $100^{\text{th}}$  day of school.

## 2<sup>ND</sup> GRADE NEWS

Well, we can hardly believe it is 2015 already. We spent the first part of the month talking about and writing New Year's Resolutions and setting goals. Celebrating Martin Luther King Day gave us an opportunity to learn about accepting and being kind to others. One of our most challenging tasks in January was learning how to subtract double digit numbers. This is something your second grader could use ongoing practice in. It is important that they draw pictures and explain their thinking when regrouping. The traditional algorithm is nice but they need to know what they are doing. We will be moving on to telling time in February. Practice with an analogue clock!

We love our Scholastic newspapers we get each week. In January there were a lot of interesting articles about animals in the Arctic and we learned about non-fiction text features. We finished up the winter DRA and will discuss the results at Parent Teacher conferences. Hopefully you have all had a chance to sign up. If there is a problem with scheduling, please make special arrangements with your child's teacher.

One of the highlights of the month was our 100th day of school on January 29. We did lots of fun activities with 100 charts, counting, writing stories, playing games, counting money, and many other things. Thank you for your contributions to some of the 100 day activities in your student's class.

### 3RD GRADE NEWS

This month in third grade, we've been working hard to get ready for the Sage Writing Assessment. The children are doing very well and we are so proud of them. We hope they are proud of themselves for the work they are doing!

February is a busy month at Shelley. We to meeting with forward you parent/teacher conferences. We are very excited to start our Time Machine projects. This will be a very successful, positive experience for all our students. Please have your child's name choices approved by Monday, February 9th. You can also help your child on our test days by encouraging him/her to do his/her best and by reassuring worrisome children that everything will be okay.

## 4TH GRADE NEWS

The fourth grade has had a month of intensive writing! The students have really progressed in their writing skills. We look forward to a grade level Spelling Bee, which is on February 2nd. The Mountain Man Rendezvous will be on February 27th! We enjoy this yearly tradition, as we try to provide an authentic experience for the students. They have been earning Beaver Pelts to use for buying and selling goods. It will be a great experience! We look forward to working with the parents in this endeavor.

## 5TH GRADE NEWS

Fifth Graders have been writing up a storm in preparation for the upcoming SAGE writing test. Using the writing tool, <u>utahcompose.com</u>, students are given a writing prompt and resource materials to review before writing an informative or persuasive essay/response using evidence from the text. The essays are scored immediately and

students receive feedback on how to improve their Receiving a score of 24+ is no easy task! As an incentive, a challenge was issued by the 5th grade teachers to complete four specific essays with a score of 24 or higher. students took the challenge and were rewarded with a 30 minute activity last Friday. A second challenge has been issued. As fifth grade teachers, we are so proud of the hard work and determination we see on our students' faces as they learn about good writing and apply that knowledge to their own writing. We'd like to thank our students' parents for the support and encouragement they give at home. We are proud of the great writing we're seeing!

## 6TH GRADE NEWS

Sixth grade has been settling into a rigorous working routine after all our fun with the holidays. We have been enjoying finishing up our study of space in science and look forward to beginning our study of heat, light, and sound. During the first few weeks of February we will be doing the writing portion of our SAGE testing. The students will have the opportunity to show their skill writing both explanatory and augmentative essays. Also, this is the time of year when information regarding junior high registration begins to come home. Look for information regarding ALL (Advanced Learning Lab) testing, immunization requirements, and registration in the coming weeks. Please contact your child's teacher with questions or concerns. Mr. Engles' class recently presented Hamlet. They did a great job! Mrs. Ricks' and Mrs. Riding's classes will be presenting their plays soon. We can't wait!

We will also be starting our NOVA program with Officer Lott from the American Fork Police Department. The NOVA program helps students learn about drug prevention, bullying, how to be safe on the internet and other important life skills. This program will continue from February 3 until May 5.
