Strengthening Families Program: A couple Windsor families have the opportunity to participate in the "Strengthening Families Program", hosted in our area through Utah Valley University and Dr. Grant Richards. This program is a research based, skill training program for the entire family developed by Dr. Karol Kumpfer and Associates based on multiple existing, scientific-based, prevention programs.

The Strengthening Families Program teaches families how to create strong bonds of love and respect through: increasing quality time together, improving parenting skills, learning effective communication techniques, stress management techniques, coping techniques for anger and criticism, holding effective family councils, goal setting for families and individuals. The program has many proven, positive results including: improved school performance, significant reductions in problem behaviors in children, reduced delinquency and reduced alcohol and drug use in teens.

a. The Strengthening Families Program requires a commitment of 2½ hours each week for weeks, beginning January 23, 2014.

Each training is divided into the following skill sets:

- i. Family Dinner (30 minutes): Families will eat together and practice communication skills with facilitators. Windsor's PTA will need help cooking the family dinners. Simple recipes and food will be brought to volunteer homes for preparation. Meals will be taken to Timpanogos High School Cafeteria by 5:00 on the appropriate day.
- ii. Individual Classes (1 hour): Parents and children divide into separate groups to learn age-appropriate skills.
- 1. Parents are taught to increase quality time with children, notice and reinforce good behaviors, manage stress, give clear directions, make family goals and contracts for change, hold effective family meetings and learn effective discipline techniques.
- 2. Children are taught communication skills, peer resistance, how to recognize feelings, problem solving, dealing with anger and criticism, consequences of substance abuse and good social skills
- iii. Family Classes (1 hour): Parents and children come back together to practice new skills learned in their individual groups such as communication, problem solving, discipline and family meetings.
- b. Spanish Speaking classes are available.
- c. This program will begin in the spring and run weekly from the 23rd for 10 consecutive weeks from 5:30 to 8:00 pm. Additional scheduling details will be forthcoming for participants.
