

Student Achievement

Teachers collaborate regularly to explore student data and make decisions about instruction. Student interventions are provided through targeted instruction based on assessment, Lexia reading software, teacher aides, and specific instruction developed by teacher teams. Students are learning now and for the future.

School Goals

Literacy: Show a 5% increase in reading benchmark pass rates. **Math:** At least 10% of students below proficiency on SAGE will reach proficiency.

Beverly Sorensen Taylor Arts Learning Program

Springside received a grant from the state for art instruction. The grant helps provide instruction for students in our art specialty classes. It also allows teachers to work side by side with the art instructor to integrate visual art in all subjects. We thank the Beverly Taylor Arts Learning Program for providing this grant.

Standards-Based Report Cards

Teachers in all grades are now using a standards-based report card to assess student progress. Teams have developed success criteria for essential curriculum standards and are working to help students meet this criteria. Success criteria is available at springside.alpineschools.org

Jr. Hope Squad

This year Springside Elementary started a Jr. Hope Squad. Hope Squad is a school-based peer support program that empowers selected students to take action to improve the school environment. Hope Squad members are trained to recognize if they or their peers are at risk as well as how to seek help from a trusted adult.

School Land Trust 2017-18

Utah's School Land Trust Administration awarded \$81,846 to Springside Elementary this year. These funds are being used to meet school goals in Literacy and Math. This includes: student computers, teacher assistants, professional development opportunities, MasteryConnect software, summer collaboration days for teachers, and student equipment and materials.
