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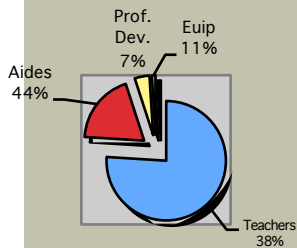

Cherry Hill's Title 1 funds: **\$590,031**

Here's where it goes



What is Title 1?

Title 1 is a federal education program under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001. Title 1 provides Utah with federal funds each year to help higher poverty schools provide supplemental educational services to meet the needs of educationally disadvantaged students. Cherry Hill is one of eleven Title 1 elementary schools in Alpine School District.

Improving the academic achievement of the disadvantaged is a major objective with Title 1. This school year Cherry Hill received \$590,031. The money is being spent in the following ways:

1. 38% goes to hiring additional teachers to provide specialized instruction and coordinate and run pilot assessment programs
2. 44% covers the cost for highly qualified aides
3. 7% goes toward professional development
4. 11% goes toward equipment and materials & supplies

Parent Involvement Policy

Parents receive feedback about the academic success and proficiency levels of their students in the following ways:

- c. SAGE Testing information in the Spring
- d. DIBELS literacy testing for grades K-3
- e. Progress reports sent home mid trimester
- f. Pre & post Kindergarten and Preschool testing

Parents are provided the following opportunities in order to formulate suggestions and to participate in decisions relating to the education of their children:

- a. Scheduled appointments by parents with school personnel as needed
- b. Parent Teacher Conferences twice yearly
- c. School Community Council meetings monthly
- d. PTA meetings monthly
- e. Back to School Night yearly

SAGE Testing

Cherry Hill participates in a comprehensive testing assessment program called SAGE. This testing protocol assesses student progress, not just an "end of the year" evaluation. This test was designed to measure their knowledge and skills on the Utah Core Standards. These standards reflect the expectations for what students should know and be able to do by the end of grade or course and be on track for college and career readiness after graduation. This testing format guides teacher instruction to best help students learn. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the front office.

Cherry Hill's School Improvement Goal

Cherry Hill is a great place to be! We have outstanding teachers, students and parents. The state grades each school in the state based on testing scores. I want to give you some information to help you understand the grading system.

We get points for Achievement and for Growth. Achievement is based on number of students that are proficient on the state tests. Growth is based on improved scores within a statewide cohort of scores calculated over time. It is a complex calculation.

As a school we had 40% proficiency in Language Arts, 34% proficiency in Math and 24% proficiency in Science. We have made good improvements in Language Arts and will be addressing how to improve in Science and Math through our School Improvement Plan.

So, what are our plans for improvement?

We have implemented Target Time at Cherry Hill on all grade levels. For a designated time each week, students are moved to smaller groups with extra help for re-teaching, reviewing or reinforcing key concepts in our core curriculum.

We have also implemented a Double Dose time where some students get an extra "small group" time, and receive an extra 75 minutes of small group literacy instruction from a certified teacher. This is funded through Title 1 and the District's Double Dosing funds.

Our grade level teams meet each Monday for an hour to discuss student achievement, look at data, and make goals and instructional plans to address the needs of all students.

As a school, we set goals each year to focus on how to improve student achievement and engagement. Teachers review these goals and use these as a guide to plan interventions for students.

Cherry Hill Elementary School Improvement Goal for 2017-2018

We will use the DIBELS testing throughout the 2017-2018 school year to ensure that students in kindergarten through 3rd grade improve by 10% in their overall proficiency as compared to the 2016-2017 school year. We will also use data from the SAGE Interim and formative assessments to ensure that we increase proficiency in all SAGE areas in grades 3-6 by at least 3% by the end of the year.

Extra Programs

Title I funds allow funding to provide several effective programs including:

- **Preschool** (two classes for preschool aged students)
- **Reading Recovery** (special tutoring for identified first grade students)
- **Specialized Reading Instruction** (literacy support for students in need)
- **Professional Development** (additional training for the principal, teachers and paraprofessionals)
- **Full time Spanish Translator** (translator available during regular school hours)
- **Double Dose Program** (Before and After school program, providing extra academic support for students in need.)
- **Target Time Interventions**

Teacher Qualifications

As a parent of a student at Cherry Hill Elementary, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teachers who instruct your child. Federal law requires the school district to provide you this information in a timely manner if you request it.

Specifically, you have the right to request the following information about each of your child's classroom teachers:

- Whether the teacher meets the state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grades and subjects he or she teaches.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or provisional status because of special circumstances.
- The teacher's college major, whether the teacher has any advanced degrees, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- Whether paraprofessionals provide services to your child and, if so, their qualifications.
